Morning: **Grievances, Abuse and Neglect Compliance with New Regulations**

This is a 2.5-hour session and will cover new requirements for your Grievance Protocol and Abuse, Neglect Protocols and Reporting. Afternoon: **Initial Care Plan and Antibiotic Stewardship Programming**
