

THE CRITICAL ROLE OF NUTRITION AND THE IMPACT ON STRESS

Even prior to the ongoing COVID crisis, health care provider stress, grief and loss has been a problem for many working in long-term care. This presentation will provide evidence via literature and professional observation regarding the impact of grief and loss as well as accumulated stressors before and during COVID-19 on healthcare providers. These experiences manifest differently for us all and this presentation will discuss the causes, symptoms, and behaviors related to stress, and identify personal and collective strategies to facilitate healing- focusing both on care for the healthcare providers as well as ways they can facilitate emotional healing for those for whom they care. In addition, this presentation will focus on ongoing stress from working in Assisted Living and Long-Term Care Facilities. **Brenda Sprinkle, Ph.D.** is a Licensed Psychologist and the Regional Director for Deer Oaks-The Behavioral Health Organization. Dr since 2007 Dr. Sprinkle has provided psychotherapy services to clients in nursing home facilities in the Austin region. She also manages/supervises Deer Oaks' Psychologists, LPCs and Licensed Clinical Social Workers in the West Texas and El Paso regions. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR UPDATE

In the last five years our records indicate that more than \$500,000 has been paid out to workers in the nursing homes industry in our area of responsibility which includes Southern Illinois and Eastern Missouri. The violations causing leading to the back pay have been minimum wage, overtime, and recordkeeping. They have stemmed from individuals doing pre and post-shift work as well as working through meal periods, having that time automatically deducted, and bonuses not being included in the regular rate of pay. **Malcolm Smith** currently serves as the Community Outreach Resource and Planning Specialist with the Wage and Hour Division of the US Department of Labor. Put bluntly, he is primarily responsible for coordinating all outreach activities within the department and is instrumental in choosing which industries will be targeted for initiatives. Prior to joining the U. S. Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division, Malcolm served 26-years in the United States Coast Guard.

FIRE SAFETY UPDATE SNF/ICF

Steven Vest is a Regulatory Auditor Supervisor with the Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services in the Section for Long-Term Care Regulation. Steven works for the Quality Assurance Unit located in the Jefferson City's Central Office. Prior to joining Central Office, Steven worked in the Region 4 office (Cameron) and held the positions of Facility Inspector, Facility Surveyor I, and Facility Survey II. Steven is a certified Fire Inspector I through the Missouri Fire Mar-shal's Office and is Life Safety Code certified. This marks Steven's 15th year with the Department.

FIRE SAFETY UPDATE ALF/RCF

The Fire Safety Inspection Unit conducts fire safety inspections for facilities and locations which are licensed or certified by several state agencies. Agencies served include the Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Mental Health, Department of Social Services, Senior Citizens Nutrition Centers, Department of Elementary and Secondary Ed-ucation, and the Veteran's Administration. The Inspection Unit is comprised of a Deputy Chief Inspector, two Regional Chief Inspectors, and 15 Fire Safety Inspectors supported by one administrative support assistant.

In FY21, the Fire Safety Inspection Program conducted 9,014 inspection activities with a re-inspection rate of 30% to en-sure safety violations are corrected and ultimate compliance with rules, codes and standards. This improves the safety of occupants and residents. The Fire Safety Inspection Program utilizes nationally recognized codes such as National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and the International Building and Fire Code to assist with interpretation of various rules and regulations. Division of Fire Safety Inspectors are certified to NFPA 1031, and have additional training in fire protec-tion systems, codes, regulations, and standards.

MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS FOR THE EXECUTIVE

Traumatic Stress on the Job Part 1: Self-care and Prevention Techniques

Feeling a little, or a lot, stressed? Learn about compassion fatigue and traumatic stress on the job. We will review resiliency factors and mental health risks for health professionals in high-stress and high-risk settings. Participants will practice hands-on techniques of relaxation and mindfulness, and develop their own prevention and self-care plan.

Traumatic Stress on the Job Part 2: CBT Concepts for Mental Health

During this session we will discuss cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) theory relating to trauma and other mental health challenges. We will review the connection between thoughts, feelings, and behaviors, and practice various CBT techniques. Participants may practice with case studies and/or their own thoughts and experiences.

Traumatic Stress on the Job Part 3: Processing Cognitive Distortions Relating to Trauma

In many cases, responses to trauma resolve naturally. However, some people experience ongoing symptoms of PTSD. We will review common cognitive distortions (negative thoughts) relating to trauma, and practice challenging these unhelpful beliefs. Participants will practice with case studies or their own distortions if they choose to. We will close up reviewing self-care techniques and create a self-action plan going forward. **Jennie Lannette Bedsworth, MSW, LCSW**, is a therapist in private practice in mid-Missouri. She has worked at inpatient state hospital settings, community mental health clinics, and as a clinical case manager. She's trained extensively in CBT therapies for PTSD, for both children and adults. She is regularly featured as a writer and expert through local media and national sites such as Psychology Today and GoodRx. She also holds a journalism degree and runs her own site with therapy resources at www.thecounselingpalette.com. She recently published the book *Finding Peace from PTSD*, available on Amazon.

MANAGING PARKINSON'S

Parkinson's Disease is a neurological condition that affects nearly 1% of all people over 60 years of age, and a significantly higher prevalence among long term care patients. This presentation aims to describe the disease as well as its treatment options. Primary focus is on pharmacologic management, including pros/cons of different available medications to treat Parkinson's Disease and some common comorbid conditions. Discussion on medications to avoid in patients with Parkinson's and a brief overview of nondrug management. **Paul Ruthman, PharmD, BCGP** Paul graduated with his PharmD Degree in 2012 from Drake University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences.
