Antipsychotic medications are associated with potentially severe adverse effects and older adults and indi- viduals with dementia are at increased risk for harm. In this session, Jordan Wagner will discuss the importance of reducing the use of antipsychotic medications for residents with dementia, review potential adverse effects of use, discuss evidence for efficacy of antipsychotics for managing behavioral symptoms of dementia, explain potential effects of withdrawing antipsychotic medications, and discuss care-planning to incorporate monitoring of antipsy- chotic therapy and management of adverse behaviors for residents living with dementia.
